Call to order made by Christina at 4 p.m.

Christina Talbot and Carolyn Milian introduced as new co-chairs. All present members introduced themselves and their representation.

SAC training PPT presented to members by Christina.

**Finance** report: presented by Carolyn. School Recognition funds balance is \$33,206.56, SAC funds balance is \$6,376.85 for a grand total of \$39,583.41. Mr. Dresback indicated that he cannot determine how to spend those funds without full approval by SAC committee.

### **Request for funds:**

- CPS clickers by Jenny Fagan – requesting 8 more clickers to use with her students. Cost is \$560, however Mr. Dresback has suggested purchasing 10 more instead of 8 to accommodate for growth.
- Memory Project – by Megan Welch - \$450 for AP students to participate in. Photos of individuals who have been abused, neglected, etc will be sent to Art students to create portraits. These original portraits will then be sent back to the families.

**2016-17 School Improvement Plan** – presented to members. Dr. Dresback explained how to read the plan. Mr. Dresback reiterated how the SIP drives our decisions on what we want to spend SAC funds on for student achievement and improvement. Christina asked everyone to please review plan and see if everything is correct and if changes are needed.

Future meeting dates were presented to committee. Voting and approval of these dates will be done online via email.

Principal update: Mr. Dresback –

- ✓ New cafeteria and new bus loop should be ready in about 3 weeks. Mr. Dresback presented aerial views of campus and upcoming changes that will allow for the new main building which will include new media center, administration offices, and house all academies except ?????
- ✓ Student enrollment - end of year last school year we ended with 2,067. Beginning of this year we are at approx. 2,300 and projection for next school year (2017-18) is 2,550. Once the new building is complete, we will be able to remove some relocatables, but not many due to growth projections.
- ✓ Parking is still a challenge until new bus loop is completed. Once it is done, the back part of facility will allow for 20-30 more parking spots.
- ✓ Power Hour began on 8/22. Everyone still getting used to it and still trying to get some normalcy. Some students are using it for extra help, working with teachers, and getting work and homework done. It is new this year. A 1 hour block for students to eat lunch, work in study groups, participate in clubs, etc.
