Message from Mrs. Kunze

Happy Friday!

The attendance procedures that were sent yesterday in a Special Edition Panther Press are not new. They are the procedures that have been in place for years at Nease, but were only found on the website.

The lines in the cafeteria are extremely slow, because students are not scanning their ID card, which means their number has to be typed into the control pad. Most students are not remembering their number, so then the number has to be looked up taking additional time. Please talk to your child about carrying their school ID at all times and that our request is very similar to being required to have your driver's license on you once it is obtained. We did discover this past week, that a picture of the original ID will scan, which is great because our students don't have any trouble remembering to take their phone with them. :) (We have a call into Cady Studios, because unfortunately a picture of a replacement ID is not scanning properly.)

The PSAT will be administered on Wednesday, October 11th to all 650 10th grader (exam paid for by the State of Florida) and the 200 9th graders and 120 11th graders who registered and paid. The PSAT takes 4 hours to administer, so students will attend 7th period only after lunch. Ninth graders not testing will rotate through 4 sessions throughout the day - link crew activity, guidance/dean presentation, Naviance/Media Center presentation, and a study hall with math and science teachers. The 11th graders not testing and all seniors will have a study hall.

ATTENTION DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENTS

Dual enrollment textbooks that were damaged by Hurricane Irma should be returned to the Media Services Department at 10 Hildreth Drive, St. Augustine, by October 15th. They will evaluate the damage and issue a new book if necessary. Any damaged books returned after October 15th will be the responsibility of the student.

Due to hurricane Irma, SJR's spring schedule they posted on September 18th was incomplete. The completed Spring schedule will not be posted until Friday, September 29th. Our original school deadline for students to turn in the SJR application and registration to Guidance was Friday, September 29th. However, due to SJR's changes, we are pushing back our deadline to **WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 4TH!**

Drop/add policy set by our School District:

If a student is enrolled in a full-credit course, the student may NOT drop the course until the end of the semester and only if the following conditions exist:

- Has a grade of D or F
- Completion of a parent conference during each grading period
- Demonstration of the student seeking consistent academic assistance
- Space available in a comparable course

At this time we would like to encourage parents to speak with the teacher. You can request a parent/teacher conference through the teacher or the guidance office. The teacher might also be able to help during EXCEL time. Another resource would be tutoring. National Honor Society students offer tutoring on Monday's from 4-5pm and Wednesday's from 3-4pm.

If at the end of the semester your child is still struggling in this course we will review options at that time.
