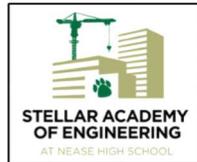

SENIORS CAN PRE-ORDER ACADEMY GRADUATION CORDS FROM MARCH 25TH- APRIL 5TH

Academy seniors are eligible to order special cords to wear during Nease's graduation ceremony. If a senior is interested in pre-ordering an Academy graduation cord, they must sign up in the front office. Cords typically cost \$8, and the payment will be due upon cord pick-up in May. Students must sign up by April 5th to pre-order a cord if they would like one. The "Academy Grad Cord" pre-order poster sign-up sheet will be located in the front office starting on March 25th. Engineering Academy students get red cords, Academy of Hospitality & Tourism students get aqua cords, and Communications Academy students receive blue cords. Again, if a student does not pre-order a cord by April 5th, the student will not be able to get a cord when the delivery arrives. Sign up on the Academy Grad Cord Pre-Order list in the front office.

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ACADEMY PROBATION POLICY

A reminder that Academy students agree to a contract at the beginning of each year stating that they will maintain certain academic and behavioral standards in order to remain in an Academy program. Academy students must maintain a total GPA of at least a 2.0, and must maintain at least a 2.5 GPA (75%) in an Academy class. A student in an Academy must also maintain a good discipline record.

In accordance with district policy, if a student does not meet these requirements, he/she will be placed on probation for a semester. If, at the end of that probation period, he/she does not have a GPA which meets the requirements, or fails to have an improved discipline record, the student will be removed from the Academy. If an Out of Zone student is removed from an Academy, he/she will be transferred back to his/her zoned school.

Letters were sent home following the release of first semester report card grades, to make students and parents aware of probationary status for the remainder of the 2018-2019 school year.
