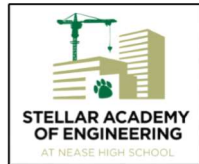

GUEST SPEAKERS SHARE INDUSTRY EXPERIENCE AND COLLEGE OPPORTUNITIES WITH ACADEMY STUDENTS



Each year we strive to bring in guest speakers to help our students see the connection between their class curriculum and the industry. We are also focused on helping students discover the vast opportunities to continue their training after high school. The 2019-2020 guest speaker events have already begun, with more on the way! On

Wednesday, September 18th, Digital Design welcomed Anne Detlefsen, the Director of Digital Production at PGA Tour Entertainment. She explained that her department includes video editors, content producers, photographers, and digital designers. Mrs. Detlefsen shared how they use social media platforms to attract a younger audience to golf, and that they utilize Adobe Creative Suite software at PGA Tour Entertainment,

which also happens to be taught in Nease's Communications Academy. She was excited to hear that our students were earning certifications in Photoshop, Illustrator and InDesign. Mrs. Detlefsen encouraged the students to get as much experience in the industry as they can, by seeking out internships and jobs that give them a variety of skills. She also answered student questions about her career.

In the Academy of Hospitality and Tourism, Professor David Buchman of Florida State College at Jacksonville's shared information on the college's Hospitality program, an off-shoot of the school's culinary program, which is ranked as one of the best in the United States. The Hospitality Management program is separating from the culinary program at FSCJ, and they have recently signed an articulation agreement with Florida International University, which will allow FSCJ Associate of Science degree graduates to enter FIU as Juniors in the University, and have the option to finish their Bachelor's Degree completely online. In FSCJ's program, they are adding a Technology and Hospitality course, a Convention and Event Management course, and incorporating a Hospitality Accounting course. Professor Buchman offered to welcome any Hospitality Academy students to tour the FSCJ program, which is now looking to begin offering some courses at the Deerwood campus. Students were able to ask questions about the program, and learned Professor Buchman's background in the industry, which included positions with Disney World and Universal Studios. On September 25th, Dr. Martin O'Neill, Head of the Hospitality Department at Auburn University, is traveling to Nease to speak with our Academy students about Auburn's degree offerings in Hospitality & Tourism.



On September 20th, a representative with the New York Film Academy visited Communications Academy students to show them how the skills they're learning in class can be sharpened at the college level. Students learned about the options to study filmmaking, broadcast journalism, digital editing, 3D animation and game design at the college, viewed student work, and asked questions about the programs.

In the Stellar Academy of Engineering, we are looking forward to welcoming Matt Clancy, Engineer and Manufacturing Director with Ultra Tech. Mr. Clancy will be discussing Innovative ideas, which Ultra Tech specializes in, with our Juniors and Seniors, as they embark on the district's Project Innovation competition. We are looking forward to welcoming many more guest speakers throughout the year.
