INSIDE THE CAREER ACADEMY CLASSROOMS

What's been going on in the Communications, Engineering, and Hospitality classes in the first month of school? Read on to find out.

ST. JOHNS COUNTY ACADEMY OF HOSPITALITY AND TOURISM

Dan O'Byrne – Introduction to Information Technology, Introduction to Hospitality and Tourism

The inaugural year of the St. Johns County Academy of Hospitality and Tourism got off to a strong start with classes introducing students to Hospitality and Tourism Management and Information Technology with Industry applications. The first few weeks were spent introducing some 60 students to the Hospitality and Tourism Industry, the goals and objectives of the Academy at Nease High School, and to each other. Students in the program come from different parts of Florida, the Nation, and the World, with a diverse set of experiences, stories and backgrounds that will make tourism come alive in the classroom. Our Academy students were even offered volunteer opportunities to assist with the 450th Celebration of St. Augustine; a great way to kick off the program. A unique classroom setting has begun to take shape and we look forward to an exciting year with ample opportunities for skills certifications and industry recognitions.

STELLAR ACADEMY OF ENGINEERING

Tim Gilboy -- Introduction to Engineering Design, Drafting 3 and 4

In all of the Stellar Academy of Engineering courses classroom procedures were established, the classes discussed what engineering is and what engineers do in multiple disciplines, and they worked on measurements and units. Introduction to Engineering Design students also spent time learning about the engineering design process. Drafting 3 students started working on the district-wide Project Green competition and researched LEED certification, while Drafting 4 students discussed assisting in the Project Green competition and researched the Cradle to Cradle philosophy. Both the Drafting 3 and 4 students also studied current event engineering applications and problems.

COMMUNICATIONS ACADEMY

Holly Bourquin -- Journalism (Newspaper)

Journalism 1 students have been learning the basics of print journalism and news writing. They began the year by considering the question, "What is News?" Students have also studied what makes content newsworthy, the main categories of news, the basics of news writing, and are currently learning interviewing skills. Journalism 2-4 are the classes that produce Nease's newspaper, The Vertical, and Happenstance, an annual literary magazine. The students are already hard at work on the first issue of The Vertical for this school year. Students are also actively recruiting advertisers

In Yearbook they have been working on training a new staff. They have 18 new staffers this year, who are learning eDesign, the yearbook software program provided by Herff Jones. The staff is also writing copy, leads, headlines, conducting interviews, and finding the most engaging angles for their yearbook spreads.

After attending an awesome conference in Stone Mountain, GA in July, the editors have been hard at work creating the cover, theme, design, and look for the 2016 yearbook. They can't share it yet, because it's a secret, but we're really excited about it!

Last week, they had lots going on in Yearbook class. On Wednesday, they had a photographer from Cady Studios come and give a mini conference on shooting the best photography possible, whether using a top of the line camera or just a cell phone at the spur of the moment. Last Friday was one of their biggest days of the year as they had "Draft Day." This is the day when each staffer chooses all their spreads (pages) for the yearbook for the entire year! As you can see Yearbook is up, running, and ready to go, for the 2015-2016 school year!

Dana Hayden – Introduction to Info Technology, Digital Design 1-3

In the Introduction to Technology class they are using an online course and eText. The course is Discovering Computers and Microsoft Office 2013. They are currently in the first chapters covering Digital Literacy. Although a lot of this covers basic computer and related technology, they are having lively discussion of the use of computers, social networking and the technology which makes it all happen. In the Digital Design classes we are working with Adobe software. Currently we are learning and integrating both Illustrator and InDesign. In Illustrator we are learning basic illustration, creating existing logos and designing new logos which requires technical and creative design skills. The logos will be placed into InDesign to create a business package which includes letterhead, business card and envelope layout. These are basics which all businesses require and a staple of the design and print industry. From these basic projects students will refine skills used with later projects, building on technical and design skills.

Christi Tilden – TV Production 1, Advanced TV Pro (Wired)

TV 1's have just finished lessons on analyzing the shows we watch, the different genres of television, television terminology, and have just started learning about shot composition. Last week TV 1's had their first opportunity to operate a video camera and will get more experience with cameras in
