ENGINEERING AND ART INTERSECT FOR STUDENT PROJECT



When Art and Science come together, it's a beautiful thing! Recently, some of Nease's AP 2D design course students teamed up with the Stellar Academy of Engineering to create unique works of art. AP Art Instructor Megan Welch learned that our Engineering Academy is home to two Glowforge 3D Laser Cutter and Engravers. She met with Engineering teacher Bergman Arias to learn about what these amazing machines can

do, and to see what our Engineering students have used them for in their classes. The lightbulb went off and Mrs. Welch asked if they could team up to create original works of art utilizing the Engineering Academy's technology. The process began with art students creating an original drawing. From this base drawing, the student traced the work using blue and red pens so the Glowforge machine would know what to cut out (designated in red), and what to

CAREER ACADEMY STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS ENRICH THE ACADEMY EXPERIENCE

Career and Technical Student Organizations (CTSOs) provide a way for Academy students to tie an extracurricular activity into their Academy curriculum. Nease offers several CTSOs: National Technical Honor Society, Technology Student Organization, DECA and Student Television Network.

The National Technical Honor Society is open to all Communications, Hospitality and Engineering Academy Juniors and Seniors. Students who are accepted into the Honor Society must have a minimum 3.0 unweighted overall GPA, and a 3.5 minimum GPA in their Academy classes. Applications are available now through October 14th. Students need to see Mrs. Soto in room D-002 or Mrs. Amato in Panther Hall 138 to get access to the application.





Students enrolled in the Stellar Academy of Engineering are invited to join The Technology Student Association (TSA). This is the only Nease student organization devoted exclusively to students interested in Engineering. Members learn through exciting Co-Curricular Competitive Events. Nease's TSA Chapter offers students a method to develop their STEM skills and demonstrate their talent, in preparation for the annual TSA State Competition and

potential National Competitions. At last year's TSA state competition Nease's TSA chapter brought home two first place wins, one second place win, three third place wins, and seven honorable mentions. If you're interested in joining TSA, see Mr. Arias in Panther Hall 221. TSA is accepting applications throughout October, to coincide with Manufacturing Month.

The DECA program is connected to our Academy of Hospitality and Tourism and aims to prepare the next generation of leaders for careers in marketing, finance, hospitality and tourism, and management in high schools and colleges around the



world. Students participating in DECA take part in competitions that pit their skills against others in our region first, commencing in a district-level awards ceremony in Jacksonville. Then, winners move on to the state competition, allowing them to test their skills against the best in Florida. Nease's chapter, established in 2018, is still young, but we have brought home both district and state awards in a number of hospitality and tourism-related competitions.



The Communications Academy takes part in the Student Television Network affiliation, which is comprised of high school TV Production programs from across the country. Upper-level Digital Video Technology students involved in our daily newscast, Wired,

compete each year in the Excellence Competition, most recently winning as the Southeastern United States' best news show in 2019. In addition, the students travel to the annual STN Convention, which brings thousands of talented TV Production students together to compete in a multitude of contests, while also providing opportunities to learn from TV and Film professionals offering informational sessions. While this year's STN competition will be virtual, students have gotten to travel to Los Angeles, San Diego, Nashville, Atlanta, and Orlando in the past to take part in the annual Convention.
