Why join an Academy or Program of Interest?


- **74%** of Nease's students are part of an Academy or Program of Interest



International Baccalaureate Program

- **IB:** A 4 year program based on college-level curriculum that is recognized internationally. A well-rounded approach to higher level education.
 - 9th and 10th grade – Pre-IB to prepare for the courseload of IB
 - 11th and 12th grade – IB Diploma program
- Pre-IB courses are a more fast-paced, writing focused, project-focused honors course.
 - Pre-IB students will also take a series of AP courses, starting freshmen year
- IB is modeled after a well-rounded college approach to learning so students should like to learn, be motivated, be independent, and have an interest in several different subject areas.
- Considerations:
 - MUST complete Algebra 1 before starting 9th grade
 - Math, Reading, and Writing Scores
 - Teacher recommendations regarding behavior in class, and dedication to learning

What To Consider When Applying

- Student must currently reside in St. Johns County
- Rising 9th and 10th grade students can apply to Programs of Interest/Career Academies at any school in the district
- However, students cannot apply for a Program of Interest/Career Academy at an out of zone school via HAC if a duplicate Academy is offered at the student's zoned school
 - Duplicate programs to Nease's offerings include IB, The Communications Academy, and ROTC

What To Consider When Applying

- Schools that offer IB/AICE: Beachside, St. Augustine & Pedro Menendez
- Schools that offer ROTC: St. Augustine & Bartram Trail
- School that offers The Communications Academy: Creekside

What To Consider When Applying

- If you are zoned for a school that offers IB/AICE, The Communications Academy, or ROTC, but are interested in our program in addition to a unique Nease Academy/Program of Interest, you must apply to an Academy that is unique to Nease via HAC, THEN:
 - Contact Amy Case if you're interested in the IB Program
 - Contact Jaime Combs if you're interested in ROTC or The Communications Academy

What To Consider When Applying

- St. Johns County does not provide transportation to students attending out-of-zone schools

Academy Application Window Open Now Through January 26th at 5 pm

- If your student is currently in a St. Johns County Public School:
 - Log in to Home Access Center to apply using the student's username and password
 - Apply for up to three Career Academies/Programs of Interest, but you must select a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd choice
- IB requires additional teacher recommendations for the four core academic subjects
- Step by step directions to apply via HAC are located on www.neaseacademies.com

How do private school, home school and virtual school students apply to a Program of Interest?

- Students must CURRENTLY reside in St. Johns county to apply.
- Parents must complete the pre-registration process for the 2026-2027 school year via the St. Johns County School CTE District Website:

- Parents will fill out the Academy Application online within the pre-registration process

- The District Office will enter the student's selections into the computer system for the Academy placement lottery
- The due date for pre-registration and application to be submitted is **January 26th at 5 pm**

Acceptance into the Career Academies and JROTC is based on a computerized lottery


- It does not matter when you apply during the application window
- For all programs **except IB/AICE**, a student's grades are not considered
- Following the lottery, applicants will receive notification of acceptance/denial via HAC in February

DEADLINE: January 26th at 5 pm

Applying to IB and an Academy

- The Career Academies and JROTC can fill up with 1st choice applicants. If a student wants to apply to a Nease Academy/JROTC **and** the IB Program, the IB Program should be listed as the 2nd or 3rd choice
- If a student is applying to an Academy/Program of Interest at a school other than Nease, and the IB program at Nease, the student should number their choices according to personal priority
- If you are zoned for St. Augustine, Pedro Menendez, or Beachside, you cannot apply to the IB program via HAC. You can apply to a unique Nease Academy/Program and then be considered for the IB program but still need to complete the teacher recommendations ahead of January 26th and notify Mrs. Case via email that your student would like to be considered.


