


Canvas Orientation – After you enter your class (next section) you will see the Canvas Orientation at the bottom of a list of items. I strongly recommend you select that first thing.




- 1. Log into your student account (if you have not established a student account, do so now)
- 2. When you are logged in you will see "Canvas" in the light green strip on the left side of your screen and in the "Student Quick Links" box or Student Drop-down menu.





6. Home - This is your class, where it all starts. Note the list on the left of the screen that names the sections of this course.




**7. Announcements** – Read current announcements and check this section regularly for new announcements.




#### 8. Syllabus













11. They will often have a **Discussion** link: It will open with a description of what you are to be discussing.




Select "Reply" to the assignment to post your "Discussion" comments – then "Reply" to others comments as directed.

# 12.Assignments – Note there are two sections in this – Upcoming and Past – Be aware of "Due Date"




# 13. Assignments -

Takes you directly to the Discussion area of the Modules.




**14.Discussions** - The Discussion area is for exactly what it says.




- Classes may have a section such as this "Coffee House" where students can communicate with each other and
  possibly discuss problems they are having with assignments and how they are working through them or where to
  find information.
- The "Introduction" section is often the first assignment for an online course. This is where you introduce yourself to the class and the instructor, tell them something about yourself such as your hobbies, your pets, how many brother and sisters you have, what you are majoring in.
- The "Discussion" postings themselves are generally on your thoughts about a specific reading you were assigned. It is also where you will respond to your fellow classmate comments on their thoughts as you are required to do as part of your assignment.


**15.Grades** – It is what it says it is. This comes from a book club group and you will not see any grades.



**16.People** – These are the participants in your class but this section may/may not be listed for your course.



### 17.Collaborations – This is not always used – but be sure to check just in case. Some courses do have group projects.



#### **18.Smarthinking Online Tutoring** – opens another tab in the browser to "Smarthinking"

- As a student, you will have a Smarthinking account. You will use your own account here to submit your papers to be reviewed and returned to you with suggestions for making it better.
- Pay attention to what they are telling you, revise your paper before submitting for a grade you can also re-submit to Smarthinking, if you wish, before submitting for a grade.
