

## **Must PASS**

- FSA (FAST) 10th Grade
- Algebra 1 EOC

## **Must TAKE**

- Algebra 1
- Geometry
- Biology
- U.S. History(All 30% of Final Grade)

## Scholar Diploma

- Pass Geometry, Biology, U.S. History EOC
- Earn 1 credit in a rigorous math course and rigorous science course
- 2 Credits in the same world language

#### State University System (SUS)

Admission into Florida's public universities is competitive. Prospective students should complete a rigorous course of study in high school and apply to more than one university to increase their chance for acceptance. To qualify to enter one of Florida's public universities, a first-time-in-college student must meet the following minimum requirements (credit earned by industry certification does not count for SUS admission):

- High school graduation with a standard diploma, a minimum of a 2.5 GPA, and admission test scores meeting minimum college-ready test scores per Board of Governors (BOG) Regulation 6.008
- 16 credits of approved college preparatory academic courses per BOG Regulation 6.002
- 4 English (3 with substantial writing)
- 4 Mathematics (Algebra 1 level and above)
- 3 Natural Science (2 with substantial lab)
- 3 Social Science
- 2 World Language (sequential, in the same language or other equivalents)
- 2 approved electives

#### The Florida College System

The 28 colleges of the Florida College System serve nearly 800,000 students. Colleges offer affordable and stackable workforce credentials including certificate programs, associate in science degrees and associate in arts degrees, which transfer to a bachelor's degree program. Many colleges also offer workforce bachelor's degree programs in areas of high demand. All Florida College System institutions have opendoor admissions for students who earned a standard high school diploma or an equivalent diploma or successfully earned college credit.

Florida College System

#### Career and Technical Colleges and Centers

Florida also offers students 49 accredited career and technical colleges or centers throughout the state, which provide the education and certification necessary to work in a particular career or technical field. Programs are flexible for students and provide industry-specific education and training for a wide variety of occupations.

Career and Technical Education Directors

Students must earn a C or better in high school courses to meet universities admissions requirements.

#### Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars (GSV) 2025-26

#### Initial Eligibility Requirements: (As determined by the Florida Department of Education.)

- 1. Submit the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) no later than August 31 after high school graduation.
- 2. Graduate with a standard Florida high school diploma or its equivalent.
- 3. Achieve the required weighted 3.0 GPA in the non-elective high school courses.
- 4. Completes at least three (3) full Career and Technical Education credits
- 5. Achieve the required minimum 3.5 unweighted GPA in Career and Technical Education credits.
- 6. Complete at least 30 volunteer service hours, 100 paid work hours, or a combination that equals a minimum of 100 total hours. For students entering grade 9 in the 2024-2025 school year and thereafter, 75 hours of volunteer service must be completed.
- 7. Achieve the required minimum scores on one of the college entrance exams per the chart below no later than August 31 of the year the student graduates from high school.


There is no need to register 10<sup>th</sup> grade students, they will receive their test at no cost through state funding.


Deadline for 9<sup>th</sup> & 11<sup>th</sup> grade students to register for PSAT is September 14, 2025


