

HOW CAN A STUDENT GET INTO AN AP COURSE AT NEASE HIGH SCHOOL?

- Students should discuss suitable options with their School Counselor during upcoming registration meetings (starting last week of January)
- Advanced Placement courses are not suitable for everyone. Prerequisites and prior performance (grades/test scores) may be required for entry into most AP courses.
- Per SJC policy, students who meet at least one of the following criteria below can take an Honors/ AP level course (final grade of C or better in previous Honors course OR a final grade of A in the previous standard level course in the related progression OR a FAST test score of level 4 or 5 in the appropriate area and not less than a FAST test score level 3 in ANY area)

AP CAPSTONE DIPLOMA- NOW OFFERED!

- Why earn it?

- Students who earn the AP Capstone Diploma are not required to earn the required test scores to receive the Bright Futures scholarship!

- Requirements:

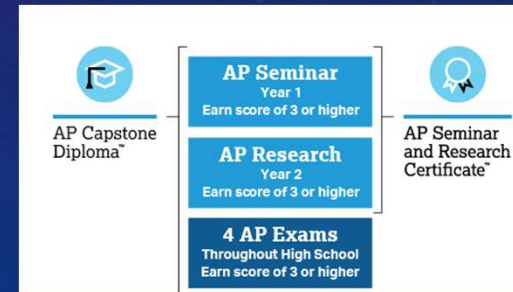
- Score a “3” or higher on the AP Seminar and AP Research exams (must be taken over 2 years)
- Pass 4 additional AP exams with a “3” or higher throughout high school.

Other ways to qualify

Students who have demonstrated academic merit through a recognition program may be eligible for Bright Futures without having to meet one or more of the requirements. Note: All Merit Recognition programs must be earned prior to high school graduation. Confirmations may come from AICE; IB and College Board as late as September. Please refer to the table below for how to qualify based on one of the merit recognition programs.

AP VS DUAL ENROLLMENT



AP (Advanced Placement)

- Students earn college credit by passing an exam at the end of the course.
- Nationally recognized curriculum. Students can see how their credit will be applied at any college:
<https://apstudents.collegeboard.org/getting-credit-placement/search-policies>
- Course grades are visible in HAC, taught by Nease teachers, and follow Nease policies (retakes, schedule change, etc)
- Classes are taught at Nease and virtual school.

DE (Dual Enrollment)

- Students earn college credit by passing the course.
- College credit is only guaranteed to be awarded for the same course code in Florida.
- Students start their college GPA (think about Bright Futures).
- Students are considered college students following college policies (No grades in HAC, no retakes, accommodations must be requested separately, dropping a course results in a “W” on the college transcript, etc)
- Classes are taught through the college online or in person at their campus.

SJRSC DUAL ENROLLMENT



- Dual Enrollment at SJRC allows you to take college courses, for FREE, while you are attending high school.
- DE Courses are weighted on a 5.0 scale, like AP courses, without the AP Exam.
- DE Courses are College courses and may have a 'final' style exam within the course.
- DE Courses at SJRC are usually transferrable to any Florida public college or university, and most credits will transfer to out of state schools. It is your responsibility as student & parent to contact your desired institution and discuss DE transfer credits. **(NOTE: NOT ALL UNIVERSITIES WILL ACCEPT THESE CREDITS FOR TRANSFER-IT IS COMPLETELY UP TO THE RECEIVING COLLEGE)**

FAQ'S

- What is my DE Eligibility at SJR? - You can take DE classes for 3 years in HS, grades 10-12 based on GPA and test scores.
- How many hours can I take in 1 semester? – Fall and Spring semester 12 DE credit hours, Summer you can take 2 classes total, regardless of credit hours.
- Who do I reach out to if I have a problem? - If you have questions/problems during the enrollment process, see your School Counselor. Once you are enrolled, all questions/problems must go through the SJRSC DE program.
- What if I sign up and want to drop? - If you are in the Add/Drop window (**dates determined by SJR**) you can drop with no penalty. After the add/drop window you will get a WITHDRAW on both your SJRSC and NHS transcripts.

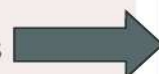

 - Counselors can direct as to what courses meet high school requirements

IMPORTANT TAKEAWAYS

- There is **NO HAC** – the college WILL NOT communicate with parents
- Student is the responsible party-**INCLUDING GETTING TEXTBOOKS**
- ALL DE courses will be placed on your high school AND college transcripts – NO EXCEPTIONS
- It is the STUDENT's responsibility to declare their need for accommodations to the Student Disabilities Services Department at SJR.
- DE students have access to all SJR resources – advising, tutoring, writing center, library, etc.

TAKEAWAYS CONT.

- Full time DE students can participate in high school activities; however, it is THEIR responsibility to meet deadlines
- Students must access their SJR email REGULARLY! This is how the college will communicate with the student
- Transportation is the student's responsibility
- Courses are offered on many platform (online, day classes, night classes, hybrid classes, Full term, A term , B term, etc.) YOU are responsible for what YOU choose

- NHS School Counselors can have discussions with students about how specific DE classes can affect their GPA, High School Graduation requirements, and High School Transcripts.
- Ultimately, Dual Enrollment courses are COLLEGE credit. NHS school counselors will not track down students for paperwork or provide college counseling to students. College courses are the decision of the student and parent/guardian.
- If the student/parent/guardian have concerns on how DE courses will affect future college/university standings, it is the responsibility of the student/parent/guardian to reach out to preferred schools to find out their requirements or policies.

Dual Enrollment ↓

Dual Enrollment provides eligible accelerated high school students the opportunity to simultaneously earn both college credit and a high school diploma. Students may take a maximum of ten (10) Dual Enrollment credits in the fall and spring terms, and six (6) to eight (8) Dual Enrollment credits for the summer term (for a total of 2 courses maximum). STEPS TO DE APPLICATION



SJR now uses an **online** platform for students and parents to complete the initial application process. Once completed, students will be given an SJR student number and email (once all paperwork is processed by SJR)



You will need to obtain your official score reports (not screenshots) from PSAT, CLT, PERT, SAT or ACT (depending upon which scores are needed for which SJR classes) and bring those score reports to your Counselor in C Pod as soon as you complete your online application.




Be sure to make an appointment with your School Counselor to see which DE courses are suitable for you and how those courses may fit into your current progress towards your NEASE graduation.

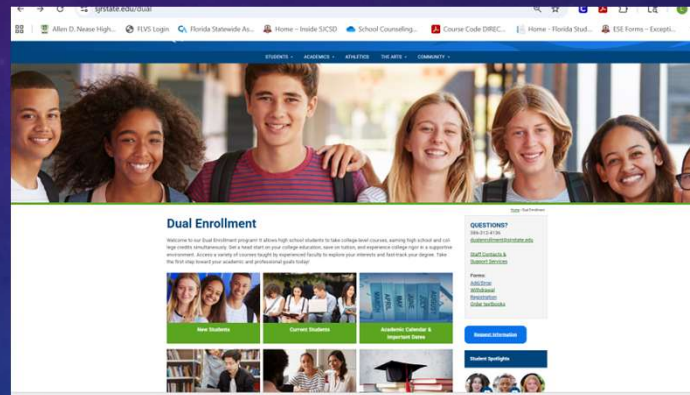
1. Create an SJR State account and complete the online application.

Your high school counselor will submit your approved application online to your DE Advisor.

Once your dual enrollment advisor receives the approval and test scores, they will be submitted for processing by the admissions department. Please check the email you entered on your application for status updates.

- **Section on Campus** = you have to GO TO the campus, this is an in person class. Attendance is taken.
- **Online** = Online on your own time. Courses will probably have deadlines, but you do not have to be online at any certain time.
- **Live Online** = Online at SPECIFIC times. Professor will be live on camera and you are required to attend specific times. Attendance is taken



DO NOT pick a section that is FULL or close to full. You will NOT get in!

Turn in your Registration form (and needed test score reports if not already done) to your counselor. **Your NEASE schedule will not reflect the SJR class/period until you have submitted ALL documentation.**

- Classes should be available to choose from on SJR website in late April, early May. For best chances of getting desired courses, complete registration form and bring to your Nease Counselor ASAP!
- If you are a new student to Dual Enrollment, Counselors will not take Registration forms until you have completed your application and handed the test scores to your counselor.
- Registration form and test scores are due before the last week of school.
