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To apply to the Nease IB Program, you MUST:

All steps should be complete and submitted by Feb. 3rd, 2020 to Missy Kennedy

Current St. Johns County PUBLIC school students:

<u>Step 1</u> - Apply online by February 3, 2020 at 5 pm - see how to register at: <u>http://cte.stjohns.k12.fl.us/join</u>.

- Step 2 –IB applicants must:
 - (a) Print out four IB Application Teacher Recommendation forms (see https://cte.stjohns.k12.fl.us/join/). Distribute to the <u>four core academic teachers</u>: Math, Science, Social Studies and Language Arts. Teachers are responsible for returning these forms to Missy Kennedy, the Nease IB Coordinator, by February 3, 2020 through interoffice mail. <u>Please give teachers at least 1 week to complete and send</u>.
 - (b) If new to St. Johns County in 8th grade please, submit 7th grade report cards and standardized test scores from previous school to Missy Kennedy at Nease by February 3, 2020. Otherwise, Mrs. Kennedy can access scores and grades if you have attended St. Johns County Schools.

Current St. Johns County PRIVATE OR HOMESCHOOL students:

 - (a) Pre-register for school on-line at the SJCSD website: <u>http://www.stjohns.k12.fl.us/student/enrollment/</u>
 - (b) Complete a Program of Choice paper application during the online pre-registration.

Distribute to the <u>four core academic teachers</u>: Math, Science, Social Studies and Language Arts. Teachers are responsible for returning these forms to Missy Kennedy, the Nease IB Coordinator, by February 3, 2020 through the mail or email. <u>Please give teachers at least 1 week to complete and send</u>.
- (d) Submit report cards (7th grade final & 8th grade January) and standardized test scores to Missy Kennedy at Nease by February 3, 2020.
