- **11<sup>TH</sup> GRADE – 4 OPTIONS (SAME AS 9<sup>TH</sup> PLUS)**
  - 5 OR 6 CLASSES AT NEASE WITH 1 OR 2 PERIODS OF CO-OP (WORK PROGRAM)
  - BLEND OF CLASSES AT NEASE AND DUAL ENROLLMENT AT ST JOHNS RIVER
- **12<sup>TH</sup> GRADE – 6 OPTIONS (SAME AS 9<sup>TH</sup> PLUS)**
  - 4 TO 6 CLASSES AT NEASE WITH 1 TO 3 PERIODS OF CO-OP (WORK PROGRAM)
  - BLEND OF CLASSES AT NEASE AND DUAL ENROLLMENT AT ST JOHNS RIVER
  - MODIFIED SCHEDULE – ONLY 4, 5 OR 6 COURSES AT NEASE
  - FULL-TIME DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENT AT ST JOHNS RIVER
  - OR A BLEND OF ALL THE OPTIONS LISTED

# COURSE SELECTION

- TEACHERS RECOMMEND ACADEMIC COURSES FOR HIGH SCHOOL USING DISTRICT GUIDELINES THAT INCLUDE: STUDENT GRADES, FSA SCORES AND EOC SCORES.
- PARENTS/GUARDIANS WILL BE ABLE TO REVIEW THE ACADEMIC COURSE RECOMMENDATIONS AND ALSO HELP THEIR CHILD CHOOSE THEIR ELECTIVE COURSES.
- CHANGES CAN BE MADE TO COURSE RECOMMENDATIONS THROUGH A STUDENT PETITION PROCESS.



# DISTRICT HONORS CRITERIA

- **GRADES - A GRADE OF “C” OR BETTER IN THE PREVIOUS HONORS COURSE.** STUDENTS EARNING A GRADE OF “A” IN THE PREVIOUS STANDARD COURSE MAY BE RECOMMENDED FOR HONORS COURSE PLACEMENT.
- **FSA - LEVEL 4 OR 5** IN APPROPRIATE AREA AND NOT LESS THAN A LEVEL 3 IN ANY AREA

# DROPPING AN AP OR HONORS COURSE

- COURSES CAN ONLY BE DROPPED AT THE SEMESTER IF...
  - STUDENT HAS A “D” OR AN “F”
  - STUDENT HAS CONSISTENTLY ATTENDED HELP SESSIONS
  - PARENT AND STUDENT HAVE HAD A CONFERENCE EACH QUARTER WITH THE TEACHER
- THERE MUST BE A SEAT AVAILABLE IN THE DESIRED COURSE.

# GRADE FORGIVENESS

- IF HS COURSE IS TAKEN IN MIDDLE SCHOOL – A GRADE OF “C” OR BELOW CAN BE REPLACED.
- IN HIGH SCHOOL ONLY A GRADE OF “D” OR “F” CAN BE REPLACED. STUDENT MUST EARN A “C” OR HIGHER WHEN REPEATING TO REPLACE THE “D” OR “F.” IF ANOTHER “D” OR “F” IS EARNED THE 2<sup>ND</sup> TIME, BOTH GRADES WILL COUNT IN GPA CALCULATION.
- IF THERE IS A COURSE THAT NEEDS TO BE REPEATED, PLEASE ADD TO THE STUDENT VERIFICATION REQUEST.



# DUAL ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN FALL 2020

- BE CLASSIFIED AS A SECONDARY STUDENT
- 3.0 **UNWEIGHTED** GRADE POINT AVERAGE
- PROVIDE ACCEPTABLE SAT, ACT, OR PERT SCORES BY APRIL 1<sup>ST</sup> – NO EXCEPTIONS!! (STUDENTS CAN MAKE AN APPOINTMENT TO TAKE PERT AT SJR)
- BE APPROVED BY NEASE HS GUIDANCE AND ADMINISTRATION
- DUAL ENROLLMENT POWERPOINT MUST BE WATCHED
- APPLICATION SUBMITTED TO MRS. GIBBS BY 1PM ON WEDNESDAY, MAY 27<sup>TH</sup> – NO EXCEPTIONS!!

# IB DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

- THE CANDIDATE HAS TAKEN AN EXAM IN EACH IB GROUP AREA. (6 EXAMS TOTAL OVER JUNIOR AND SENIOR YEAR)

<b>Group 1- Language &amp; Literature</b>	<b>Group 4- Sciences</b>
<b>Group 2- Language Acquisition</b>	<b>Group 5- Mathematics</b>
<b>Group 3- Individuals &amp; Society</b>	<b>Group 6- Arts</b>

- THE CANDIDATE MAY CHOOSE EXAMS TAKEN IN JUNIOR YEAR TO COUNT TOWARDS THE IB DIPLOMA.
- AS A JUNIOR, THE CANDIDATE CAN ONLY REGISTER FOR NO MORE THAN 2 SL EXAMS.
- THE CANDIDATE MUST REGISTER FOR 3 HL EXAMS IN THE SENIOR YEAR. CANDIDATES MAY TAKE UP TO 4 HL EXAMS.

# TO EARN THE IB DIPLOMA:

- THE CANDIDATE MUST EARN AT LEAST 24 POINTS OR MORE.
- THERE IS NO GRADE 1 AWARDED IN A SUBJECT/LEVEL.
- THERE ARE NO MORE THAN TWO GRADE 2S AWARDED (HL OR SL).
- THERE ARE NO MORE THAN THREE GRADE 3S OR BELOW AWARDED (HL OR SL).
- THE CANDIDATE HAS GAINED 12 POINTS OR MORE ON HL SUBJECTS (IF YOU TAKE FOR 4 HL SUBJECTS, THE THREE HIGHEST GRADES COUNT).
- THE CANDIDATE HAS GAINED 9 POINTS OR MORE ON SL SUBJECTS (CANDIDATES WHO REGISTER FOR TWO SL SUBJECTS MUST GAIN AT LEAST 5 POINTS AT SL).
