- <u>CAS Projects</u> Continue to work on Stage 3 (Action) steps for your project. You may contact Mrs. Kennedy by email with any questions or ideas you may have. The Action Stage of your project should be completed before you return to school on August 10th.
- CAS Project Presentation Please see the next page for instructions to create your CAS Project Presentation movie. This will be due in September of your senior year (which can be very busy with college stuff!). It is a creative collaboration with your CAS team, so it is advised to complete it promptly after you complete your action steps.

<u>EE</u> – You will also need to focus on your Extended Essay this summer. It is important that you continue to work on your paper including further research, editing and revising current work, focusing your research question, revision of the introduction, main body, and drafting your conclusion. Stage 4 Project Presentation Video Guidelines

- 7-10 minute team video explaining your engagement with the project from brainstorm through action phases.
- All team members must participate in the video
- Presentation should address:
 - 1. How and why you decided on the project and who would participate on your team. (brainstorm/research stage)
 - 2. The learning outcomes you chose and how you met those outcomes.
 - 3. Explain your process for setting and achieving project goals. (plan & action stage)
 - 4. Explain any struggles or setbacks and how you overcame them.
 - 5. How each team member grew as an IB Learner during the project
- Project Presentation movie must be submitted in MP4 format. Final work should be posted to the Managebac Assignment (September) and the evidence/reflections tab of your project proposal in Managebac.
