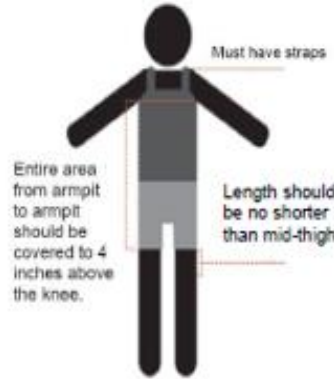


DRESS CODE POLICY

Expectation: Student clothing choices are both respectful of the school community and are appropriate for an educational environment.

Dress Code Standards

- Clothing must cover areas from one armpit to the other armpit, down to mid-thigh. Tops must have shoulder straps.
 - Examples of Violations
 - Garments worn on the upper half of the body that are low cut and revealing.
 - Tube top or tube top w/arm cuffs.
 - Undergarments do not count as "straps."
 - Shirts short enough to expose midriff.
 - Sagging pants. All pants must be worn around the waist.
 - Garments worn on the lower half of the body must not be shorter than mid-thigh or have holes exposing skin above mid-thigh.
- See-through or mesh garments must be worn with opaque clothing over it or underneath that meets the standard for clothing coverage.
- Shoes must be worn at all times and should be safe for travel around campus. Backless shoes are allowed; however, slippers are not permitted.
- Headgear is permitted but must not cover student ears or be distracting to the educational environment. A teacher may require headgear to be removed while in their classroom.
 - Examples of Violations
 - Hoodies pulled up covering ears
- No clothing or accessory advertising alcohol, drugs, weapons, nudity, profanity, etc.
- NO earbuds in classrooms, gym, locker room or auditorium.
- One earbud ONLY while outside and in cafeteria.



Students who violate the dress code will be provided a Nease t-shirt, shorts or leggings to wear, so they may attend class. T-shirt, shorts or leggings must be returned to receive personal clothing item(s) back. Earbuds will be taken and returned at the end of the day in the ISS Room in C-Pod.

Dress Code Progressive Discipline Procedure

Students who break the dress code will be provided a Nease t-shirt or shorts/leggings to wear, so they may attend class. T-shirt or shorts/leggings must be returned to receive personal clothing item(s) back.

Earbuds will be taken and given back at the end of the day.

- 1st offense – warning
- 2nd offense – lunch detention
- 3rd offense – 2 lunch detentions
- 4th offense – Defiance - 1 day of ISS (in-school suspension)
- 5th offense – Defiance – 1 day of ISS
- 6th offense plus – Defiance - OSS (out-of-school suspension)

Dress Code violations will be erased after 1st semester, so everyone starts over 2nd semester.



Cell Phones

Cell phones can NOT be used in classrooms, which includes gym and locker room.

Cell phones **MUST** be placed in holder in classroom. If student refuses, he will be sent to the dean's office.

- 1st offense – warning
- 2nd offense – warning
- 3rd offense – official warning with dean
- 4th & 5th offense – In-school suspension
- 6th or more offense – out-of-school suspension

Phone violations will be erased after 1st semester, so everyone starts over 2nd semester.



SJCSD Code of Conduct

Vaping / Contraband

- **Level III Contraband**
 - Use, possession and or distribution results in
 - 3 days of out-of-school suspension.
 - NOT on school property at all.
 - Continued violations of a level III offense result in it being regarded as repeated misconduct and could result in Level IV referral to Gaines



Bus Behavior

Activities That Count	Activities That Do Not Count
Volunteering at a food pantry	Donating non-perishable foods
Activities on behalf of a candidate for public office, supervised by a non-relative with the campaign	Walking around in a neighborhood posting political signs with a family member
Teaching English skills to a foreign exchange student under the supervision of a non-relative, non-profit staff member	Hosting a foreign exchange student
Volunteering at an animal shelter under the supervision of a non-relative shelter staff member	Fostering an animal at home
Helping at a church carnival open to the public and free of charge, supervised by church staff	Helping at an event that is not fully open to the community, where people must pay to participate
Completing an internship at a non-profit organization	Doing non-paid work at a for-profit business
Required training prior to a service activity (ex: Training on building a well prior to a mission trip where that will be done.)	Claiming hours for an activity that is required for academic credit or licensure (ex: First Aid/CPR, school course, school drama production where course credit is earned)
Volunteering at a hospital or nursing home	Being paid to work at a hospital or nursing home
