Yesterday morning, SJCSD Superintendent, Mr. Tim Forson, sent out a message regarding the school tragedy that occurred this week in Georgia. Our heart goes out to the community, students, and parents of Apalachee High School. Please know that we remain vigilant with keeping our school safe and secure. Our number one priority is the safety of our Panther family. Earlier this week, we held our first lockdown drill. Our students and staff did a good job of following directions and procedures. We continue to partner together with the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office to provide a safe learning environment.

At the end of every Panther Press, posted on the school website, and found on posters throughout the school you will see information about the FortifyFL app. FortifyFL is a suspicious activity reporting tool that allows you to instantly relay information to appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. If you or your student(s) learn about any type of threat made against our Panther family, please do not hesitate to report the activity on FortifyFL. We are all in this together.

As we enter the 4th week of school your student should be getting into a routine that includes a study and homework schedule. They may also need a quiet or focused location to engage in their studies. Working with a peer or study group can also engage their interest in learning.



# **DRESS CODE POLICY**

**Expectation:** Student clothing choices are both respectful of the school community and are appropriate for an educational environment.


### Dress Code Standards

- Clothing <u>must cover</u> areas from one armpit to the other armpit, down to mid-thigh. Tops must have shoulder straps.
  - Examples of Violations
    - Garments worn on the upper half of the body that are low cut and revealing.
    - Tube top or tube top w/arm cuffs.
    - Undergarments do not count as "straps."
    - Shirts short enough to expose midriff.
    - Sagging pants. All pants must be worn around the waist.
    - Garments worn on the lower half of the body must not be shorter than mid-thigh or have holes exposing skin above mid-thigh.
- See-through or mesh garments must be worn with opaque clothing over it or underneath that meets the standard for clothing coverage.
- Shoes must be worn at all times and should be safe for travel around campus.
   Backless shoes are allowed; however, slippers are not permitted.
- Headgear is permitted but must not cover student ears or be distracting to the educational environment. A teacher may require headgear to be removed while in their classroom.
  - Examples of Violations
    - Hoodies pulled up covering ears
- · No clothing or accessory advertising alcohol, drugs, weapons, nudity, profanity, etc.
- · NO earbuds in classrooms, gym, locker room or auditorium.
- · One earbud ONLY while outside and in cafeteria.


Students who violate the dress code will be provided a Nease t-shirt, shorts or leggings to wear, so they may attend class. T-shirt, shorts or leggings must be returned to receive personal clothing item(s) back. Earbuds will be taken and returned at the end of the day in the ISS Room in C-Pod.

# **PSAT/NMSQT TESTING INFORMATION**

(9th, 10th, & 11th Grade ONLY)

College Board has decided to go digital! Please see below for specifics on 9th, 10th, and 11th grade test date specifics. Nease High School will administer the PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test – National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) to students on:

# • Wednesday, October 23, 2024

The purpose of the test is to give all students an opportunity to experience taking a college readiness test and identify students who might benefit from advanced coursework. The PSAT is also the exam that is used for 11th graders to qualify for the National Merit Scholars Program. Additionally, a score of 430 on the PSAT Math qualifies as a concordant score for the Algebra I EOC.

# **10TH GRADE STUDENTS:**

There is no need to register 10th grade students, they will receive their test at no cost, through state funding. However, if 10th grade students choose to opt-out please return <a href="PSAT: 10th Grade">PSAT: 10th Grade</a>
 Opt Out Letter to Ms. Messenger in PH 225, or at the front office desk.

# **9TH AND 11TH GRADE STUDENTS:**

- 9th graders wishing to take the test Must be in Geometry or HIGHER. If you qualify to test, you must register online:
  - <u>CLICK HERE>></u> to register and pay through SchoolPay. The last day to pay & register will be Friday, September 13, 2024. There is NO possibility of testing if payment is not received by this date. Your student's online Score Report for the PSAT/NMSQT® should be available November 7th from College Board.
- 11th graders wishing to take the test must register online:
  - <u>CLICK HERE>></u> to register and pay through SchoolPay. The last day to pay & register will be Friday, September 13, 2024. There is NO possibility of testing if payment is not received by this date. Your student's online Score Report for the PSAT/NMSQT® should be available November 7th from College Board.

Students will receive an Official Student Guide to the PSAT/ NMSQT® through their English classes. This guide contains valuable information as well as a full-length practice test with answer keys.

# STUDENTS WITH AN IEP OR 504 PLAN:

Since the PSAT/NMSQT are not FLDOE exams, accommodations for testing through an IEP or Section 504 must be approved through College Board prior to taking the exam. Please be sure to complete the accommodation consent request and return to Ms. Messenger by September 2, 2024, in PH 225.

- <u>CLICK HERE>></u> to for the Consent Form. Please note that this form is routinely completed during IEP and 504 meetings. This must be processed by this time for CollegeBoard to approve your school-based accommodations. Requests after this date will not be processed and students will test without school-based accommodations.
- If you have already applied for accommodations with CollegeBoard, you do not need to apply
  again, you retain the accommodations until one year after graduation date. However, if your
  accommodations change, it is YOUR responsibility to complete a new form and resubmit in
  plenty of time.

# ACT Non-College Reportable Exam (12th Grade ONLY)

This test is for 12th grade students who have not met the FSA Grade 10 ELA and/or the Algebra 1 EOC graduation requirement. Students who participate in this ACT-NCR experience will be granted accommodations (i.e., extended time) in hopes that the extra time will give the student a better chance to acquire the necessary ACT English and Reading score of 17.5 to meet the FSA Grade 10 ELA graduation requirement and/or ACT Math score of 16 to meet the Algebra 1 EOC graduation requirement. However, because these accommodations are not officially approved by College Board, results earned during a non-college reportable ACT administration cannot be used for admissions or scholarship purposes.

The ACT will be offered at Nease on Wednesday, October 16, 2024 to 12th Graders ONLY. The cost of the ACT exam is \$38.50. CLICK HERE>> to pay through SchoolPay. Payment is due by Wednesday, September 4th, 2024.

# SAT-NCR (Non-College Reportable) (12th Grade ONLY)

This test is for 12th grade students who have not met the FSA Grade 10 ELA and/or the Algebra 1 EOC graduation requirement. Students who participate in this SAT-NCR experience will be granted accommodations (i.e., extended time) in hopes that the extra time will give the student a better chance to acquire the necessary SAT English and Reading (EBRW) score of 480 to meet the FSA Grade 10 ELA graduation requirement and/or SAT Math score of 420 to meet the Algebra 1 EOC graduation requirement. However, because these accommodations are not officially approved by College Board, results earned during a non-college reportable SAT administration cannot be used for admissions or scholarship purposes.

The SAT-NCR will be offered at Nease on Wednesday, October 23, 2024 to 12th Graders ONLY. The cost of the SAT-NCR exam is \$48.00. <u>CLICK HERE>></u> to pay through SchoolPay. Payment is due by Friday, September 13th, 2024.





Thank you so much for anything you can help out with so we can continue this little "perk" for our students.


