- EARN 24 CREDITS
- ENGLISH – 4 credits
- MATHEMATICS – 4 credits (Algebra State EOC 30%, Geometry State EOC 30%)
- SCIENCE – 3 credits (Biology State EOC 30%)
- SOCIAL STUDIES – 3 credits (3 ½ credits for Class of 2027 and beyond)
 - (World History-1 c, US History State EOC 30%-1 c, US Government ½ credit & Economics ½ credit and Economics & Personal Financial Literacy – 1 credit for Class of 2027)
- PERFORMING/FINE ARTS, SPEECH, PRACTICAL ARTS & CTE – 1 credit
- PHYSICAL EDUCATION – 1 credit (HOPE – Health Opportunities Through Physical Education)
- ELECTIVES – 8 credits
- CUMULATIVE GPA OF 2.0 ON A 4.0 SCALE
- STATE ASSESSMENT REQUIREMENTS
 - Must pass required 10th grade FAST ELA with a level 3 or higher or meet concordant score.
 - Must pass Algebra 1 (3 or higher) OR Geometry (3 or higher) EOC or meet concordant score.
 - Must take the EOC for Biology, Geometry & US History (unless taking AP or DE)

Scheduling Options

- **9TH & 10TH GRADE – 2 options**
 - 7 classes at Nease in traditional classroom
 - Blend of 7 classes at Nease: traditional classroom & virtual classes in Nease lab
- **11TH GRADE – 4 options (same as 9TH & 10TH plus)**
 - 5 or 6 classes at Nease with 1 or 2 periods of Co-op (work program)
 - Blend of classes at Nease and Dual Enrollment at St Johns River and/or FCTC
- **12TH GRADE – 7 OPTIONS (SAME AS 9TH & 10TH PLUS)**
 - 4 to 6 classes at Nease with 1 to 3 periods of Co-op (work program)
 - Blend of classes at Nease and Dual Enrollment at St Johns River or FCTC
 - Modified schedule – 1 to 3 periods modified only IF all graduation requirements have been met.
 - Full-time dual enrollment student at St Johns River
 - Blend of all the options listed

Virtual classes MUST be scheduled prior to the start of the school year

Co-op – JRs & SRs Only

- Students receive 1 credit for 5 hours of work per week.
- Can take up to 4 credits while in high school.
- Required Co-op paperwork must be submitted online.
- If students do not have a job now, they will select electives and have until July 25th to prove they have a job for electives to be dropped and Co-op added.
- Monthly paperwork must be submitted for grade in course.

Zero-hour Option

- Class is taken before school starts Mon, Tue, Thu, Fri from 8:15am to 9:10am
- Students would take 8 courses.
- Options:
 - 11th grade IB – AP US History
 - 12th grade IB – History of Americas
 - 10th grade- Pre-IB Chemistry

Dual Enrollment Requirements to Participate in Fall 2024

- Be classified as a secondary student
- Have a 3.0 **unweighted** grade point average
- Completed the online application by February 14th for FCTC
February 28th for SJRSC

Course Selection

- Teachers recommend academic courses for high school using district guidelines that include student grades, FAST scores and EOC scores.
- Parents/guardians will be able to review the academic course requests and help their child choose their elective courses.
- Changes can be made to course requests through a student petition process.

District Honors Criteria

- **Grades - A grade of “C” or better in the previous honors course.** Students earning a grade of “A” in the previous standard course may be recommended for honors course placement.
- **FAST - level 4 or 5** in appropriate area and not less than a level 3 in any area.

Dropping an AP or Honors Course

- Courses can only be dropped at the semester IF...
 - Student has a “D” or an “F”.
 - Student has consistently attended help sessions/EXCEL.
 - Parent and student have had a teacher conference.
 - There must be a seat available in the desired course.

Grade Forgiveness

- If HS course is taken in middle school – a grade of “C” or below can be replaced.
- In high school only a grade of “D” or “F” can be replaced. Student **MUST** earn a “C” or higher when repeating to replace the “D” or “F.” If another “D” or “F” is earned the 2nd time, both grades will count in GPA calculation.
- If there is a course that needs to be repeated, please add to the student verification request.

Reading

- Schools are required by the State to provide an intervention for students scoring level 1 and 2 on FAST Reading.
- For 25-26
 - Level 1s: Current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders will be placed in stand alone reading course
 - Level 1 & 2s: 12th graders focusing on ACT/SAT/CLT prep.

- Government Honors in 10th grade can be paired with DUAL ENROLLMENT LIFE AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT (SLS 1301) **OR** WRITING FOR COLLEGE SUCCESS
- Dual Enrollment ART APPRECIATION (ARH 1000)
- Physical Science Honors- for 9th grade students concurrently enrolled in Algebra 1 Honors

Course Registration

- Counselors will visit English classes to review course requirements and to answer questions.
- Students will select their electives. They WILL CHOOSE BETWEEN 4 AND 6 ELECTIVES AND RANK their PREFERENCE.
- Choose academics and electives carefully -these course choices are used to build the high school student and teacher schedules—with state mandated class size restrictions you are making a year-long commitment to these courses.

Course Petition Process

- If student does not meet course requirements for a course OR you want to make a change after course sheets are submitted, student MUST complete petition link.
- We will monitor link and make simple course request changes frequently before school is out and until the July 25th deadline.
- For course requests where criteria is not met, we will review new data and make decisions July 7th – 11th.
- Changes will NOT be made through emails. The petition link must be used.

Important Dates

- End of March/Beginning of April - Master Schedule is built
- May – counselors work with students on scheduling conflicts
- May 30th – LAST day to submit elective change using petition link
- July 23RD & 24th – Schedules are available on HAC to view
- July 23RD – Link opens to submit a CORE course level change (Standard to Honors OR Honors to Standard – IF there is a seat.)
- July 25th – Link closes & Last day to submit Co-op paperwork
- July 25th – Aug 1st – Requests for core course level changes are reviewed and entered. If changes occur, they will be available after August 4TH.
- August 4th – Schedules are viewable on HAC
- August 11th – First day of school!
