








Congratulations to our International Thespians

ACADEMY INTENT TO RETURN PROCESS: CONTINUING OR DROPPING A PROGRAM FOR 2026 - 27

In December, all Communications, Hospitality, and Engineering Academy students will be asked to indicate if they want to remain in their current Academy for the 2026-27 school year by signing an Intent to Return roster. If the student checks "Yes," than that student will be automatically re-enrolled in the Academy for 2026-27. The student will also receive a recommendation to move on to the next level Academy course, as long as they are meeting Academy requirements. If an Academy student checks "No" on the roster, to indicate that they do not want to continue in the Academy next year, a Program of Interest Drop Form will be sent home with those students in January. The drop form must be completed by the student and parent and returned to Mrs. Combs in order to remove the student from the program for 2026-27.
