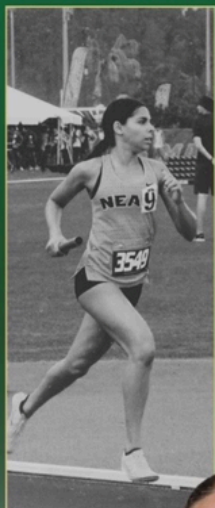

Also, thank you and congratulations to Coach Heidi and Coach Dennis!

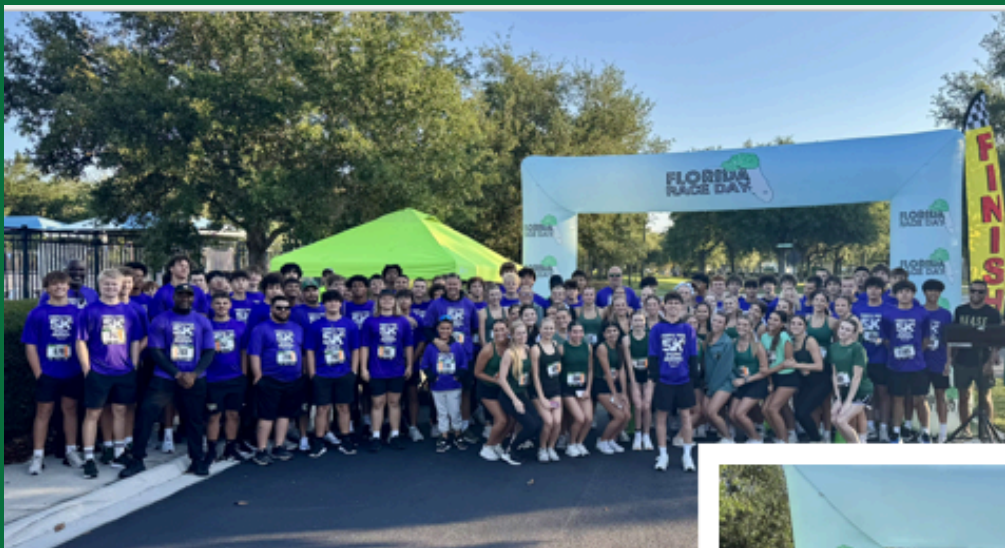

SENIOR ENGINEERING CLASSES COMPETE IN ACE REGIONAL CHALLENGE

Nease High School was represented by three senior-level engineering teams in the regional ACE competition, with one team in each Request for Proposal (RFP) category: Modular Classroom, Next Generation Animal Shelter, and Community Park/Open Space.

Each team developed comprehensive design solutions that reflected real-world applications of architecture, engineering, and construction practices. These projects emphasized innovation, sustainability, functionality, and community impact. The project also had a trades build aspect where students had to design and build a bench related to their theme.

The Community Park team designed the “Momentum Surf Park,” a large-scale recreational facility featuring a surf lagoon, multipurpose spaces, and integrated stormwater management systems. This past Friday, May 8th, a system-generated email went out to all students that **STILL** have media items (library books, textbooks, fines, etc). It was a courtesy email simply to inform students & parents of the current items/fines your student may have on his/her account. There was a lot of important information and instructions in the email, so please read it carefully. **Please DO NOT pay any fines until I send out another email on Wednesday, May 27th** with instructions. **ALSO, PLEASE DO NOT pay for fines for OTHER schools using our links.** This creates an accounting nightmare for us. We are receiving textbooks and library books by the dozens every day and get them checked in as quickly as possible.

As a reminder, ALL library books, textbooks, in addition to possible printing charges from our media center computers **MUST** be returned or paid for by the last day of school, May 29th. Students with outstanding items or charges on June 1st will have their HAC access blocked until items are returned or paid. Thank you so much for your patience during this hectic time. The last day our media center will be open for student access in the mornings and during lunch will be **May 19th**. After this date, *only* students returning textbooks will be able to come in.
